

Pair Queried

In Murders

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (UPI).—

A father and son accused of criminal attacks on women and children in several states are being questioned in connection with at least 11 unsolved murders, the Boston Record American reported Tuesday.

All the murder victims were girls and there was sufficient similarity in the slayings to cause authorities in New York, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Maine and Connecticut to explore the possibility they were committed by the same killer or killers.

District Attorney John J. Droney declined comment but did confirm that detectives from Utica and the Bronx, New York, Maine and Connecticut have made inquiries about the men arrested in connection with a minor case here. One suspect has made admissions about both attacks and given a confusing story about a murder, but the second has made no statement.

Authorities declined to disclose the names of either man.

"Many of the cases seem to parallel and that is why the other jurisdictions expressed interest," one official said.

The murders still unsolved about which the two have been questioned include: Michelle Wilson, 13, Boxford, Mass., November, 1969; Diane Toney, 11, New Haven, Conn. September 1969; Mary Mount 10, New Canaan, Conn., June, 1969; Dawn Cave, 14, Bethany, Conn., May, 1969; Diane Bowman 14 Torrington, Conn. February, 1972; Jennifer Noon, 5, New Haven, Conn., September, 1970; Mary C. Olenchuk, 13, Kennebunk, Maine, August, 1970; Debra Lee Horn, 11, Allentown, N.H., January, 1969; Carmen Colon 10, Rochester, N.Y., November, 1971; Joanne Pecheone, Utica, January, 1972, and an unidentified 17-year-old girl in the Bronx, N.Y., earlier this
